

Lessons from a hill "Acting with Integrity" W/C 3rd Mar 2024

A few years ago, I received a call from someone who'd started coming to the church that I was in at the time. He told me that he was stranded in a nearby town and had no way of getting home, and asked if he could borrow some money to get a taxi. He sounded desperate, so I sent some money via my Paypal account - he promised to pay me back. Shortly after this, I got a message to say he'd moved out of the area. I never saw him again – nor the money - I'd been taken advantage of. How sad it is to live in a world where we cannot trust people.

The text for this week calls us to a people of integrity; people who say what we mean and mean what we say.

Welcome: Have you ever been taken in by a lie? Briefly, share your experience.

Worship: Spend some time in worship. Plan an act of worship that is appropriate to your group.

- 6. What does verse 37 mean by "anything beyond this comes from the evil one?"
